
WATER POLO CANADA OFFICIALS TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION PROGRAM (OTCP)

<u>Mission:</u> To identify, recruit, train, and promote the development of consistent competent Canadian water polo officials.

<u>Vision:</u> To maintain a leadership role in the education, development, and performance of world class Canadian water polo officials.



The Community Sport Referee course targets officials with little to no water polo experience. The basics of refereeing and minor officiating are taught specifically for children's water polo.

The Region Referee course targets officials with a basic knowledge of the rules of water polo. This course targets referees and athletes who are being introduced to competition at the regional and provincial levels.

The Provincial Referee course targets officials with knowledge of the rules of water polo. This course targets referees and athletes who are refining their competitive skills at the provincial and national levels.

The National Referee course targets officials with prior water polo experience. This course targets referees and athletes who are perfecting and maintaining their competitive skills at the national level.

Referees can be "in training", "trained", or "certified" in any of the OTCP levels. Referees may challenge their certification at the Regional and Provincial levels by demonstrating their competency by achieving the desired outcomes through evaluation.

The OTCP certifies officials who have demonstrated their ability to apply critically important competencies in referee situations relevant to the athletes they officiate. This means that referees must not only know about officiating but be able to demonstrate their ability to apply this knowledge in the game situations. Certification is valid for no longer than 2 years and professional development is required to maintain certification.


